I. WHO WE ARE.

As a division of the Department of Public Safety, Hawaii Correctional Industries (HCI) provides work related skills for offenders, which increase their employment prospects upon release. Qualified, able-bodied inmates are utilized in the manufacturing or production of goods and services needed for the construction, operation and maintenance of any office, department, institution or agency supported in whole or in part by the state, cities, or counties of Hawaii.

Current programs located at Halawa Correctional Facility include the Department of Public Safety Canteen, which services the Oahu institutions with their inmate stores; a printing plant with products ranging from business cards to instant document reproduction; a sewing plant currently manufacturing Adult Correctional Officer uniforms for all Department of Public Safety institutions; installation of panel systems; and maintenance labor forces out of the Oahu Community Correctional Center, Hawaii Community Correctional Center. Waiawa Correctional Facility and Women's Community Correctional Center. There was a furniture plant at our Hawaii Branch on the Big Island specializing in the manufacturing, assembly, and installation of panel systems. They are currently being used for maintenance labor forces by the County of Hawaii.

II. OUR PURPOSE.

We seek to build the very best products and services by building great people. Based on H.R.S. Chapter 354D, HCI provides one of the best opportunities for all able-bodied inmates who are "ready, willing, and able" to work; a blueprint by which they can succeed when released. We provide comprehensive work rehabilitation and training through the use of non-uniform civilian staff.

We employ several hundred inmates every year. Employment opportunities extend and consist of working internally at our Print, Furniture, Canteen, or Sewing shops; or externally through one of our work-lines that keep many parts of Oahu and Hawaii beautiful. Everyday close to 60 inmates are out among the public cleaning and maintaining our highways and byways. We clean, cut grass, trim trees, and pickup trash along the roads everyday.

Correctional Industries is mandated by law to be a self-sufficient and self-sustaining agency. All monies collected by the Department from the sale of goods and services produced in accordance with H.R.S. Chapter 354D are deposited into the Correctional Industries' revolving fund. The proceeds in the Correctional Industries' revolving fund are utilized for: purchase or lease of supplies, equipment, and machinery; the construction, lease, or renovation of buildings used to carry out the purposes of Correctional Industries; the salary of personnel necessary to administer the enterprises established; payment of inmates for worker assignments and all other necessary expenses. Correctional Industries does not receive any general fund monies.



V. POSITION LISTING.

HCI EXEMPT AND CIVIL SERVICE POSITIONS:

HCI is legislatively approved to have not more than (42) forty-two, exempt positions within the Correctional Industries Division, Department of Public Safety. These positions are required to staff all of the Correctional Industries programs and all expansion plans. While Correctional Industries has a total of 42 exempt positions authorized, 22 positions have been filled as of June 30, 2011. The remaining 20 established positions are in active recruitment. We are currently developing new revenues streams with State, County, and private sector agencies. Once in place, the new revenue streams will provide additional work opportunities to more inmates. The exempt positions currently filled are utilized in the following areas: PSD Canteen, Light Construction Operations, Sewing, Mattress, PSD/DOE Partnership – Playground Installations, Business Office/Marketing and Sales, Distribution/Warehouse, Furniture / Panel Plant at the Kulani Correctional Facility (which has currently been shutdown) and Joint Venture Programs on all islands.

Although Correctional Industries has had a slight increase in inmate employment, 338 in FY 2010 compared to 360 in FY 2011, the slight increase is due to our being able to have inmates from Waiawa Correctional Facility and Women's Community Correctional Center to work with our supervisors. The inmates that we employ are staying on the job for longer spans of time and with fewer turnovers. Correctional Industries will continue to expand its current programs and will continue looking for new programs to increase sales and inmate employment. These programs provide quality products at cost savings to the State of Hawaii. They also provide inmates with vocational training, keep inmates productive, and/or redirect inmates to have a trade and or work ethic when released.

VI. GOALS, & FUTURE ENDEAVORS.

Hawaii Correctional Industries also, provides external work lines for The Department of Transportation highway maintenance and other state agencies providing construction, renovations, demolitions, installation and moving needs.

Expansion is planned for the Department of Transportation to add an additional external work-line for highway landscaping maintenance, which will increase the total number to 6. We also have plans to expand our services to offer fencing, new installation and maintenance for the Department of Transportation, other state and city agencies as well as non-profits.

HCI has joined efforts with the Department of Education and National Safe Surfacing Initiative out of Iowa to renovate and produce brand new playgrounds for Hawaii's children. More than 260 playgrounds throughout the State of Hawaii are currently using obsolete and unsafe materials.

Correctional Industries currently has a joint venture with a private sector company on the Big Island, where a workforce of approximately eight inmates at a time is employed to assist with fruit picking or packing. Offenders receive minimum wage up to prevailing wages. HCI plans to increase inmate work opportunities by securing contracts in labor/building maintenance such as pressure washing on the Big Island.

VII. PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION

Correctional Industries is a field division under the Deputy Director of Corrections, Department of Public Safety. Hawaii Revised Statutes Section 354-D requires that Correctional Industries programs be expanded to provide comprehensive work programs for all qualified, able-bodied inmates. These programs are mandated to: generate revenue to sustain their operation and allow for capital investment; provide specific training skills for offenders which increase their employment prospects when they return to their community; provide a maximum level of work for all qualified, able-bodied inmates; provide an environment for the operation similar to that of a private business operation; encourage cooperative training ventures with the private sector; and provide low-cost construction, renovations, and repairs of facilities for government agencies and non-profit organizations.

Correctional Industries operates programs using sound fundamental business practices to provide quality goods and services on time to customers, whether those customers be the public, governmental agencies, non-profit organizations or the correctional system itself.

Growth of Correctional Industries programs is necessary to attain the mandate to provide a maximum level of work for all qualified, able-bodied inmates. The salaries of personnel necessary to administer the enterprises are required to come out of the Correctional Industries revolving fund and not the state general fund.
