#### REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE

### RELATING TO SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII (SLH) 2012, Act 106

This report has been prepared in compliance with Part VII, Sections 133.1 of Act 106, SLH 2012. This Act requires the Department of Public Safety (PSD) to prepare a report on the Justice Reinvestment Initiative (JRI) that includes information on the change in status of inmates affected by the initiative, including the number returned to the State from non-state facilities, number enrolled in reentry programs, and number released from custody, success and challenges of the JRI, and to-date and projected data for the current fiscal year to fiscal year 2015-2016. The Act specifically calls for the submission of a report to the Legislature, thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

At this time, there is no information available on the change in status of inmates affected by the JRI. In FY 2011, 527 inmates returned to the State from non-state facilities, and in FY 2012, 522 inmates returned to the State from non-state facilities. As of July 1, 2012, 120 inmates were returned to the State from non-state facilities. As of October 8, 2012, there are 1,611 inmates in contracted facilities in Arizona.

In Fiscal Year 2012, 1553 inmates were released from the custody of the Department. Of this total, 575 inmates were released on parole (compared to 654 inmates released in Fiscal Year 2011) and 978 inmates were released after completing their maximum term of incarceration or for other reasons.

The Department has provided reentry programs (e.g. substance abuse and sex offender treatment, furlough, job services etc.) to inmates for many years. The current number of inmates enrolled in reentry programs that assist inmates with their transition and reentry back into the community can be viewed in Table 1.

As a result of the JRI, three interagency organizational groups: Steering Committee, Core Implementation Team, Issue-Specific Workgroups were formed to plan and implement the changes under Act 139, SLH 2012. Also, a pretrial assessment instrument has been selected that will be used statewide, and pretrial staff have been trained to apply the instrument. The limiting of the parole revocation sanction to six months for first time technical violators began on July 1, 2012. Lastly, the Department has implemented the amendments made to §353-22.6 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, that mandates the Department to enforce victim restitution orders against *all* moneys earned by the inmate or *deposited or credited to the inmate's individual account while incarcerated.* The amount deducted was increased from 10% to 25% of the total of all moneys earned, new deposits, and credits to the inmate's individual account. The moneys intended for victim restitution is deducted monthly.

JRI has presented some challenges. There are noticeable gaps in resources in the judicial system that could impede the enhancing of the pretrial release process. Also, the need to retrain all of the parole officers and correctional case managers in scoring a validated risk assessment tool has been a bit inundating. Lastly, the filling of the new parole board

member positions and the maintaining of the quorum has been somewhat challenging. Under previous law, decisions made by the parole board required an agreement between two of the three members. Under present law, three of the five members are needed to be in agreement.

The actual to-date and projected data is undetermined at this time as most of these initiatives took effect on July 1, 2012. The funding assistance for implementation from the Council of State Government (CSG) will not be available until December 2012. Any costs for this JRI to-date, will be funded by the Department. Caution should be given to the projected savings that were initially reported by the CSG staff as these figures were provided before any amendments were made to Act 139, SLH 2012.
