LAUMAKA WORK FURLOUGH INMATE MISSING FROM OVERNIGHT HEADCOUNT

HONOLULU – Laumaka Work Furlough Center inmates George Goings and Michael Salas were reported missing from a headcount at about 1:45 a.m. State Sheriffs and Honolulu Police were immediately notified.

Goings was serving time for various drug charges and ownership/possession of a prohibited firearm. His next parole consideration hearing is September of this year. Salas was serving time for Robbery 2. His parole consideration hearing is also scheduled for September.

Goings is 43-years old. He is 5'9", weighs 207 lbs., and has brown hair and brown eyes. Salas is 26-years old. He is 5'9", weighs 135 lbs., and has brown hair and brown eyes.

Goings and Salas were both community custody inmates in the work furlough program with pass privileges. Community custody is the lowest classification status.
