LAUMAKA WORK FURLOUGH INMATE RUNS FROM WORK FURLOUGH CENTER AFTER WORK

HONOLULU – Work furlough inmate Sean Young returned to the Laumaka Work Furlough Center after work this evening. While being processed at 6:20 p.m, he ran from the furlough center office. State Sheriffs and HPD were notified.

Young is 31-years old. He is 5'10" tall and weighs 203 lbs. He has brown hair and brown eyes.

Young is serving time for Theft, Unauthorized Control of a Propelled Vehicle and Criminal Property Damage. His next parole hearing is scheduled for October of this year. He faces an additional escape charge when found.

Young is a community custody inmate in the work furlough program with pass privileges. Community custody is the lowest classification status.

The Laumaka Work Furlough Center is an apartment-like complex off Laumaka Street, one block away from the Oahu Community Correctional Center. Inmates assigned to Laumaka are either actively seeking employment or working in the community.
