OCCC WORK FURLOUGH INMATE FAILS TO RETURN TO FACILITY AFTER WORK

HONOLULU – Oahu Community Correctional Center (OCCC) work furlough inmate Daniel Seyler left yesterday at 5:15 a.m. from Laumaka to go to work. He was supposed to return from work at 10:30 p.m. State Sheriffs and Honolulu Police were notified.

Seyler is 52-years old. He is 6'3" and weighs 205 lbs. He has hazel eyes and brown hair that is balding on top.

Seyler is currently serving time for Assault 2 and Failure to Comply with Sex Offender Registration Requirements. (Reason for the "failure to comply" charge - He was required to update his registration to reflect the Assault 2 charge. He updated the registry and was in compliance before being allowed to participate in the furlough program.) His next parole hearing is scheduled for September of this year. He faces an additional escape charge when found.

Seyler is a community custody inmate in the work furlough program with pass privileges. Community custody is the lowest classification status.
