BIG ISLAND EXTENDED FURLOUGH INMATE FAILS TO CHECK IN

KONA – Extended furlough inmate Race Bolner failed to report for his scheduled check-in in Kona this morning. State Sheriffs and Hawaii Police were notified.

Inmates in the extended furlough program live and work outside of the facility but must check in at various times throughout the month.

23-year old Bolner is classified as community custody which is the lowest custody level. He is 5'8", weighs 140 lbs. He shaves his head bald and has brown eyes.

Bolner is serving time for theft, forgery, fraudulent use of a credit card. Escape 2 is expected to be added to his charges. His next parole hearing was scheduled for December.
