TWO LAUMAKA FURLOUGH INMATES FAIL TO RETURN TO FACILITY FROM JOB-SEEKING PASS

HONOLULU – Work furlough program inmates Vincent Sullivan and David Holt failed to return from a furlough pass to the Laumaka Work Furlough Center this evening. Sullivan and Holt left this morning on separate job-seeking passes and were both scheduled to return by 5 p.m. State Sheriffs and Honolulu Police were notified.

Sullivan was serving time for Robbery 2, Unauthorized Entry into a Motor Vehicle and Unauthorized Control of a Propelled Vehicle. Escape 2 is expected to be added to his charges. His next parole hearing is scheduled for September.

Sullivan is classified as community custody which is the lowest custody level. He is 38-years old. He is 6'0" and weighs 201 lbs. He has brown hair and brown eyes.

Holt was serving time for Promotion of a Dangerous Drug 2. Escape 2 is expected to be added to his charges. His next parole hearing was also scheduled for September.

39-year old Holt is also classified as community custody. He is 6'3", weighs 148 lbs., and has brown hair and brown eyes.
