LAUMAKA WORK FURLOUGH INMATE MISSING FROM FURLOUGH CENTER

HONOLULU – Laumaka work furlough inmate Gilbert Rivera Jr. was summoned to meet with his case manager. He didn't show up at the office and was reported missing at about 1:30 p.m. HPD and Sheriffs were immediately notified.

Rivera is serving time for Burglary 2 and Theft 2. His next parole hearing was scheduled for May. He faces an escape charge when found.

53-year old Rivera is 5'11" tall and weighs about 170 lbs. He has brown eyes and brown hair and may have a long, gray goatee. He also has several tattoos around his face and neck.

Anyone who sees him is urged to call 911.

Laumaka is a minimum security work furlough center for community custody inmates. It is located a block away from OCCC. Inmates assigned to Laumaka are either actively seeking employment or working in the community.
