SHERIFFS SEEKING INFORMATION ON HOMELESS MAN WHO CAUSED SCHOOL NEAR WASHINGTON PLACE TO GO ON TEMPORARY LOCKDOWN

HONOLULU – At about 7:45 a.m. State Sheriffs Capitol Patrol responded to a call at the Queen Liliuokalani Building about a homeless man creating a disturbance on property. Sheriffs responded and found him sleeping on the building's air conditioning system on the back side of the building, under the overhang. They ordered him down and that's when he showed what appeared to be a sharp object, climbed over a fence to the St. Andrews Priory property and ran.

St. Andrews Priory School went on lockdown as a precaution. Sheriffs searched the school but did not find him on the grounds. The all clear was given at the school at about 9:10 a.m.

Witnesses report seeing him running towards the downtown Alakea area. The man looked to be in his mid-to-late 30's. He was wearing a black hat, shirt and pants, and he had a band-aid near his right eye.
