DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY COVID-19 UPDATE

HONOLULU – Effective April 1, 2022, the Department of Public Safety switched to weekly reporting of COVID stats. The data is updated on PSD's dedicated COVID-19 webpage every Wednesday.

COVID-19 testing is continuously being conducted in the state prisons and jails as well as in the contracted Saguaro Correctional Center in Eloy, AZ. The latest testing updates from the correctional facilities for the 6/22/22 – 6/28/22 time period, are as follows:

Oahu Community Correctional Center – 279 inmate test results; 44 positive, 235 negative. There were four (4) positive staff test results reported and three (3) staff recoveries.

Waiawa Correctional Facility – 181 inmate test results; 24 positive, 157 negative. 10 inmates have recovered.

Maui Community Correctional Center – 462 inmate test results; 22 positive, 440 negative. 13 staff test results; Two (2) positive, 11 negative. Four (4) staff have recovered.

Kauai Community Correctional Center – 91 inmate test results; One (1) positive, 90 negative. Two (2) inmates have recovered. One (1) positive staff test result was reported.

Halawa Correctional Facility –There was one (1) positive **staff** test result two (2) **staff** recoveries reported. There were also 101 negative inmate test results and one (1) inmate recovery reported.

Hawaii Community Correctional Center – 84 negative inmate test results. Seven (7) inmates have recovered.

Kulani Correctional Facility – 20 negative inmate test results. One (1) staff recovery was reported.

Women's Community Correctional Center – 38 negative inmate test results and one (1) inmate recovery was reported.

COVID-19 updates for other PSD Divisions are as follows:

Administration Division – Three (3) positive staff test results and four (4) recoveries were reported during this time.

Sheriff Division – Four (4) employees have recovered during this time period and returned to duty. The Sheriff Division is clear of all active COVID-19 cases.

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) continues to encourage all staff and inmates to voluntarily get tested and receive the COVID-19 vaccination.
