CLINICAL PREVENTIVE SERVICES

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1.0 PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that incarcerated individuals are provided with clinical preventive services as medically indicated.

2.0 SCOPE

This policy and procedure shall apply to all correctional facilities, their assigned personnel, and contracted staff.

.2 <u>Definitions</u>

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a. Responsible Physician: A designated M.D. or D.O. who has the final authority at a given facility regarding clinical issues and whose decisions cannot be countermanded by non-clinical staff.

4.0 POLICY

.1 Clinical preventive health services shall be provided for incarcerated individuals as medically indicated.

5.0 PROCEDURES

- .1 The Medical Director and responsible physicians shall determine the medical necessity and/or timing of screenings and other preventive services (e.g., mammograms, colorectal screening, prostate screening, Pap smears) based on United States Preventative Services Task Force Recommendations and Specialty Clinical Practice Guidelines.
- .2 The Medical Director and responsible physicians shall determine the medical necessity and/or timing of screening for communicable diseases (e.g., HIV, hepatitis, syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia), as well as laboratory confirmation, treatment, and follow-up as clinically indicated, based on United States Preventative Services Task Force Recommendations and Specialty Clinical Practice Guidelines.
- .3 The Medical Director and responsible physicians shall determine the frequency and content of periodic health assessments.
 - a. If the incarcerated individual is younger than 45 years old with no comorbidities, the registered nurse shall complete a periodic health assessment annually.
 - If the incarcerated individual is older than 45 years old and/or has comorbidities, the medical provider shall complete a periodic health assessment annually.
- .4 Clinical preventative health services shall be available upon request and as clinically indicated.
- .5 Immunizations shall be administered by nurses to incarcerated individuals as clinically indicated based on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Immunization Schedules

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.6 The dentist manager and dentists shall determine the frequency and content of periodic dental evaluations.
