


Act 176, SLH 2021 requires the Department of Education, Department of Health, Department of Public Safety, Department of Defense, and the University of Hawaii System to ensure that a certain percentage of fresh produce purchased is fresh local agricultural products and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or food products meet incrementally-increasing benchmarks by January 1, 2025, January 1, 2030, January 1, 2035, January 1, 2040, January 1, 2045, culminating in a 50% benchmark by January 1, 2050.

The Department of Public Safety submits the following report of its progress in achieving the required benchmarks.

Produce, as defined in Act 176, includes "fruits, vegetables, staple starches, nuts coffee, eggs, poultry and poultry products, livestock and livestock products, milk and milk products, aquaculture and maricultural products, and horticultural products". By definition, the Department of Public Safety (PSD) spent \$306,386.93 or 3.44% of total food purchases on "produce" in FY 2023.

The Department of Public Safety continues to work closely with vendors to increase procurement of locally sourced products and attain the benchmarks as set by Hawaii State Legislature. Complications in achieving this goal include funding, State procurement rules, vendor supply shortages, providing nutritious meals within budget, and attempting to revise vendor contracts mid-term.



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
